A. Called to Order

Having a quorum, the Regular Council meeting was called to order by Mayor Randy Gawith at 6:00 PM. F. ACTION ITEMS

F-1 Police Officer Hire – Chief Caldera introduces Adrian Inzerillo as the new candidate for the Police Department. Corporal Badal has completed the background check with no concerns. He also states that Adrian will be a good addition for the Police Department, and he has high moral and ethical standards. Adrian has also passed the medical and psychological exams. Adrian provides a summary about himself and family. The Chief explains that the Police Department has completed six interview cycles and Adrian is a good fit for the City of Pilot Rock. Corporal Badal also speaks highly of Adrian. **Councilor Doherty made a motion to approve the hire and Councilor Sandy seconded. Councilor Kaneaster voted yes, Councilor Hinkle voted yes, and Councilor Schademan voted yes. Motion carried: 5 – Yes 0 - No**

City Recorder administers the oath to Adrian, and he accepts.

F-2 Umatilla County Agreement for sale of police vehicle – Chief Caldera presents an agreement from Umatilla County for the purchase of a third police vehicle. City Council approved the purchase at the October 17, 2023, meeting but the agreement was not available at the time. The 2019 Ford Explorer Police Interceptor cost was originally \$22,500 and is now \$22,000. Councilor Sandy made a motion to approve the agreement and Councilor Doherty seconded. Councilor Kaneaster voted yes, Councilor Hinkle voted yes, and Councilor Schademan voted yes. Motion carried: 5 – Yes 0 – No

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F-3 Public Safety Surcharge Increase – City Recorder presents resolution #700 which increases the public safety surcharge \$3.00 due to the hiring of a new police officer. The new hire will begin in late December and the increase would be effective on January 1, 2024. Councilor Doherty made a motion to approve resolution #700 and Councilor Sandy seconded. Councilor Kaneaster voted yes, Councilor Hinkle voted ves, and Councilor Schademan voted yes.

F-4 Gravel Purchase – Public Works Director explains that the city has no gravel. The type and uses for the gravel were explained and he is requesting to purchase gravel. He gives details on the local cost and the cost of two other companies outside of the City of Pilot Rock. Councilor Doherty states that he sees three prices but only one price to crush. There was discussion about various companies to obtain three quotes. Councilor Doherty made a motion to table until we get two more prices to crush, and Councilor Sandy seconded.
