COMPLETE MINUTES ON OUR WEBSITE

- Councilor Hinkle was sworn in and Council accepted the elections results of the November General election.
- Councilor Moss was appointed to Council President
- Council was asked to consider amending the R-2 zoning ordinance to include an RV Storage Lot as a permitted conditional use. After hearing concerns from citizens, Council tabled the matter until further information was available.
- Council approved the Welcome to Pilot Rock sign design and cost.
- The Chamber of Commerce lease agreement was approved.
- Three citizens had applied for the open Councilor position. After hearing from each, Council voted and Deacon Perkins was appointed to Council. His term will run until December 31, 2016.
- Council approved the use of the Council Chambers for The Pilot Rock Knitting club.
- Council directed Teri to look into Council approval for A&V to lease to T-Mobile and report back by February 17, 2015.

- Annexation of property on NE Delwood and NW Elder
- Recruiting a new Police Chief
- DEQ requirement to upgrade the lagoons.
- Replacement of the stairs or route over the bluff to school.
- A water booster station near NW Delwood.

There were 198 dog @ large and/or dog complaints in 2014; and a similar number in 2013.

Please protect your animals, respect your neighbors and obey the law by keeping your dog(s) on your property.

Ordinance #443 Sec. 6.5

- A. Any dog running at large within the corporate limits of the city is hereby declared to be a public nuisance.
- B. It is unlawful for any owner or keeper of a dog to permit it to run at large. Proof that a dog, not on a leash or in the vehicle of its owner, is off the premises of its owner or keeper is prima facie evidence of a violation of this section.
- C. Dogs running at large may be picked up by the Animal control officer or Police Officer and impounded in the animal shelter provided by the city.
- D. The Animal Control Officer or any Police Officer may lawfully kill any vicious or mad dog running at large.

Impounded the fees are as follows.

- 1st offense- \$25 plus \$5.00 for each additional day in the pound.
- 2nd offense-\$35 plus \$5.00 for each additional day in the pound.
- 3rd offense- \$45 plus \$5.00 for each additional day in the pound


