## TRAVEL SAFE THIS HOLIDAY!

### City of Pilot Rock

The next City Council meeting will be held on June 3, 2014

The following items were discussed at the May 20, 2014, Council meeting:

1. Richard and Rebecca Carnes of Archie's Restaurant asked Council to consider changing the ordinance and allow Archie's to serve alcohol on the side walk until 8pm. Council directed staff to look into the issue and present a staff report for action at the next Council meeting.
2. Council approved the 2nd reading of Ordinance No. 561, which will annex the property at 611 NW Cedar.
3. Council approved the 2nd reading of Ordinance No. 562, which amends the permitted uses for a heavy industrial zone.
4. Council approved a resolution transferring funds from contingency to pay for the accounting software upgrade.
5. Council was informed that before deeding the property to the Bike Pit, the property will need to be partitioned.
6. The 2014-2015 Budget Hearing was held. During the 2.5 hour hearing, Council heard from the citizens present and addressed the following issues.
  - a. Originally staff presented a balanced budget which proposed decreasing the Public Safety Surcharge from \$5 to \$3, a 5% wage increase, a \$1.50 water fee increase and paying off the LOCAP loan.
  - b. The Budget Committee did not agree that the Public Safety Surcharge should be reduced and in their approved budget, which was presented to Council, increased the surcharge back to \$5.
  - c. At the budget hearing Council reduced the Public Safety Surcharge back to the originally proposed \$3. At no time was the Police Dept. budget cut. The reduction is made possible due to additional revenues from franchise fees.
  - d. Council reduced the requested wage increase from 5% to 3%.
  - e. Council approved the \$1.50 increase to the water surcharge. In addition a motion was passed that Councilors will pay the additional \$1.50 increase.
  - f. Council approved paying off the LOCAP loan.
  - g. Council approved the budget with the above changes.
7. After executive session Council directed staff to look into finding a land use attorney.






