The following topics were discussed at the last Council Meeting on

October 16, 2012

Lost and Found Youth: Offers positive role models for at risk youths. They work with them to help them make good choices. They help out in the community in a variety of ways and offer incentive programs for the kids. Lost and Found Youth is looking for funding to help keep the Pilot Rock chapter going strong. The Pilot Rock Together organization has pledged a donation of \$300+ and the Downtown Association will make a donation as well as a way of thanking them for all they help they gave cleaning up after last weekend's big community yard sale.

City Employee

Job Description: Staff has been working on the handbook and found it necessary to update the job descriptions as well. Council was given a copy of each job description during the October 2, 2012 meeting so that they had time to read them over before approving them. By motion Council did approve the job descriptions at the October 16th meeting.

Proposed Wage Scale:

The handbook refers to annual increases. A proposed pay scale was given to Council at the October 2nd meeting so that they had time to look it over before considering it at the next meeting. There has not been a pay scale in place since 2008. The proposed pay was developed using the current wages of City employees. The pay scale will help in budgeting and in maintaining moral and good performance, as well as recruiting and maintaining quality employees. By motion Council approve the pay scale.

Exempt Employee Positions:

Council considered what positions should be considered exempt. There was also discussion regarding comp time. Council agreed to give employees who have incurred a lot of comp and vacation time until June 30, 2013 to get their time down.

Screening and Interview Committee:

Council appointed a screening and interview committee to consider applicants for the Administrative Assistants position.

Approve Comp Time:

Council approved comp time for Teri Porter as she is having to learn the Administrative Assistant position and will be doing that work in addition to hers until a new Admin. Assistant is hired and trained.

Parking in front of the Pavilion: Councilor Hinkle raised a concern that trucks are parking in front of the Pavilion which has made it difficult for the Farmers Market to be seen from the hwy. A sign was suggested that no overnight parking was allowed. Council agreed that it is City owned property and trucks can park there but they would not be allowed to do so if there is an event going on.

A Message From Your Fire Department!

In the event of a fire, remember that every second counts, so you and your family must always be prepared. Escape plans help you get out of your home quickly. In less than 30 seconds, a small flame can get completely out of control and turn into a major fire. It only takes minutes for a house to fill with thick black smoke and become engulfed in flames.

Prepare and practice your fire escape plan twice a year with everyone in your household, including children and people with disabilities. It's also a good idea to practice your plan with overnight guests. Some tips to consider when preparing your escape plan include:

- * Draw a map of each level of your home and show all doors and windows. Have two ways out of each room. Make sure all doors and windows that lead outside open easily.
- * Only purchase collapsible escape ladders evaluated by a recognized testing laboratory. Use the ladder only in a real emergency.
- * Teach children how to escape on their own in case you cannot help them.
- * Have a plan for everyone in your home who has a disability.
- * Practice your fire escape plan at night and during the daytime.
