## TAMÁSTSLIKT TO HOST VETERAN TRIBUTE EVENTS

On Saturday October 22, 2011, at 1:00 pm, Tamástslíkt Cultural Institute will host the Modern Warriors Reception for all veterans and active duty servicemen and women. The event is scheduled in conjunction with Tamástslíkt's hosting of the American Veterans Traveling Tribute (AVTT) presented by St. Anthony Hospital at Tamástslíkt October 20-23. The Traveling Tribute includes a 370 foot long replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall in Washington, D.C. The Tribute contains 58,253 names of Vietnam era mortalities. At eight feet tall, the memorial is the largest Wall replica traveling the USA. Visitors will be able to locate individual nameplates at the locator tent and create rubbings of loved ones' names on paper. The Wall Tribute is accompanied by 11 display panels describing other conflicts in U.S. history. There is no admission fee for the Tribute. Tamástslíkt's admission fee to its Honoring Our Veterans gallery exhibit will be waived while the outdoor AVTT Tribute is onsite.

Each day's activity around the Tribute will follow changing themes. On Thursday, October 20, a 'Tribal Welcome' and traditional services kick off at 1:00 pm with a program led by the George St. Dennis American Legion Post 140 and remarks by Tribal leaders. On Friday, October 21, 'Honoring First Responders' will include participation by the Tribal, State and Pendleton Police Departments as well as Tribal and Pendleton Fire Departments. Specialized equipment will be on display. A wreath laying ceremony for first responders will begin at 10:00 am and will include remarks from agency representatives. Each day's program will include Posting of the Colors, Pledge of Allegiance and singing of the National Anthem by such talent as the Prescott, Washington, School Band and Carina Minthorn Vasquez from Mission.

Saturday, October 22, will be dedicated to 'Honoring Veterans', starting at 10:00 am with a wreath laying ceremony for nine conflicts, Gold Star Mothers and POW/MIAs. The Gold Star Mother will be Anne Stump of Pendleton who lost her son Adrian in Operation Enduring Freedom in 2005. The keynote speaker will be retired Oregon Army National Guard soldier Luke Wilson of Hermiston who lost his left leg in 2004 in Operation Iraqi Freedom. At 5:00 pm, the George St. Dennis Post will lead a procession from the Tribute to the CTUIR Veterans Memorial at the old July grounds for a candlelight vigil. At 7:00 pm there will be a Wall Touching Ceremony back at the Tribute.

Sunday, October 23, closing ceremonies for the Tribute will begin at 10:00 am with a nondenominational church service. The Tribute will be open 8:00 am until 10:00 pm each day, except Thursday when it opens at noon, and Sunday, when it will close at 3:00 pm.
