City of Pilot Rock

1. Council approved the corrected Sewer resolution.
2. Council was informed that the Welcome to Pilot Rock sign was not covered by insurance. Council approved staff to apply for a grant to pay for the Welcome to Pilot Rock Sign.
3. A citizen was granted a leak adjustment on her utility bill.
4. Council approved a vacation request for a City employee.
5. Council declined replacing the windows in the Council Chambers. Instead the existing windows are to be repaired.
6. Jim Hatley addressed Council with a request that the City pay for half of the booster station that he would like to put in on the North West hill. The booster station would service Mr. Hatley's lots that he intends to develop, as well as several other homes on the hill. Council requested that staff compile additional information and put it on the agenda for the next council meeting as an action item.
7. Council was presented with a rough draft of the Recreational Park Ordinance. The Planning Commission will review the draft at its meeting on October 14, 2014. A final draft will be presented to Council for approval at the November 4, 2014, meeting.
8. Council was made aware that American Tower will be adding another antenna to the tower. The City will receive 50% of all revenues American Tower receives from that additional tower.
9. A citizen suggested to Council that the City form a CERT (citizens emergency response team).
10. Council went into executive session to consider a real property transaction. When they returned to open session they directed staff to move forward with the Sundown Project.
