## Pilot Rock Community Days August 16-18

### City of Pilot Rock

The next scheduled City Council meeting will be August 20, 2013 in City Council Chambers @ 7 pm. Please welcome our new Superintendent of Schools, Mr. Steve Staniak!

The following topics were discussed at the August 6, 2013 meeting. There were 2 Public Hearing. Letters were sent to the affected neighbors within 250 ft, and a public notice was placed in the EO.

Public Hearing regarding Jim Hatley's request to partition his land on Stock Drive. Council agreed to the partition, but made inquiries regarding who will pay for running water to the property. Council asked staff for additional information to be discussed at a later date.

Public Hearing: Jim Hatley is proposing putting in a small RV park on SW 3rd. He is requesting to vacate a portion of the public right of way on SW 3rd, to rezone the property from residential to commercial, and then to be granted a conditional use permit. Council heard from the citizens present and will make a decision at a later date.

Council approved the Library to apply for the Ready to Read Grant.

To assist in filling the Administrative Assistant Position at City Hall, Council approved forming an interview committee and appointed Councilor Moss to serve on the committee.



### Why would anyone want to live in Pilot Rock?

When I moved to this area 16 years ago from southern Oregon, I knew nothing about Pilot Rock. One of the first memories I have was my realtor wanting to show me a house in PR. He said the owner was building a new house. But what I remember is when he said "no one ever leaves Pilot Rock they just move to different houses". I thought, not me. First chance I get I am moving to Pendleton. That year my oldest daughter was starting kindergarten. That is when I started to see how special this place was. The teachers were great, the people were friendly, and the community was safe. The older my girls got the more I saw. Amazing people who worked very hard for the kids in Pilot Rock to have positive things to do. Most for FREE. Some kind of sport to play year round, 4H, music, drama, and church groups. Just to name a few.

The support the sports teams get from the community compares to any small town, who is proud of their town. But what I just experienced from this community is overwhelming. I coach a Little League softball team. 10 young ladies that through countless hours of hard work, and dedication won the Oregon State JR softball championship. With a trip to Tucson Arizona a week away, we needed help. A lot of help. The numbers being estimated to get the team down there, house, and feed them was inconceivable to me. I have never liked asking for money from people, but being a youth coach it happens every year. Usually we need six or seven hundred dollars. Now we needed THOUSANDS.

Before the celebration was over after winning state in Klamath Falls, I got a call from our Mayor. Virginia asked me if she could do some fundraising on our behalf. I won't say how much she got us, but let's just say you better not answer the door if she comes knocking. I don't think anyone can tell her no. The team worked several different fundraisers. Each one raked in record breaking amounts of donations.

This past few weeks just confirm what I already knew. Pilot Rock has great people living here. Generous and supportive, always there to help each other. I have graduated two daughters from, and one starting PR high school. In the past 16 years I have a lot of memories in this town now. I can't think of a better place to raise my girls.

Now I know why no one ever leaves this town.




