



**Birch Creek Assessment and Action Plan**

The Birch Creek Assessment and Action Plan project that started in January 2015 is coming near its completion in 2016. This work encompasses a watershed assessment looking at hydrological functions, stream formation processes, fish habitat and passage, ranking the limiting factors in the watershed and addressing what actions would be the most beneficial to restore functionality in the watershed.

Residents of the Birch Creek watershed are invited to join the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation, Umatilla Basin Watershed Council, Oregon Dept. of Fish and Wildlife, US Forest Service and GeoEngineers for a meeting Wednesday July 27<sup>th</sup> from 6-8 pm at the Pilot Rock City Chamber for a meeting to discuss progress on the Assessment and Action Plan, and steps moving forward with implementing the Action Plan.



High School registration is less than a month away and parents will receive a letter after the first of August. Registration days will be the following:

Thursday, August 11—7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade

There will be some changes at PRHS for the next year. Parents and students need to be aware and prepare prior to the beginning of school.

- 1) Each classroom will now have a cell phone parking area, which each teacher will enforce for ALL students. The students will need to turn their phones off and place them in the box as they enter each classroom. If parents need to reach their students during class time, they should call the office at 541-443-2671 and we will make sure the students are called to the office for the emergency information. Parents need to support this because cell phones have become a disruption for the learning environment.

- 2) As parents do school shopping please keep in mind the rules for attire. We do not allow students to wear tops with less than two-inch coverage on the shoulder. Shorts and skirts must be longer than the fingertips extended down. Clothing must have backs. No underwear may show. No handkerchiefs, hats or other headwear can be worn in class. Illegal, abusive, drug or alcohol remarks on clothing is not allowed. Don't waste money on inappropriate clothing.
