





4. Nominee has demonstrated a high degree of cooperation in community & civic enterprises.


Endorsement letters & other documentation describing the nominee's qualification for the award should accompany this nomination form. Please highlight significant contributions to the community the individual has made.



PRES is Getting a New Playground!

Thanks to your efforts and support, and a generous grant from the Wildhorse Foundation, we officially have the money to purchase new play equipment for our students. Unfortunately, unexpected expenses keep cropping up. The expenses not officially funded so far are include: large equipment for excavating and ground prep, surfacing costs (bark chips), a 9 and 12 inch auger for digging holes for the play structure posts, curbing for the play area, some kind of equipment to mix thousands of pounds of concrete, and food for our volunteers.

As a result, PTC is looking for volunteers/donators who have large equipment available to help with the playground rebuild project between June 10th and 18th. For sure we will need some large equipment such as a dump truck, bull dozer, backhoe, and augers for preparing the ground surface and digging holes for the posts. In addition, we will need some type of cement mixing equipment as well as a couple large trucks for transporting concrete materials for this project. Once again, thank you, for all your help not only raising the funds necessary for purchasing the new playground equipment, but also in supporting this ongoing community/school project.
