City of Pilot Rock

The next scheduled City Council meeting will be held on June 18th, 2013. To be placed on the agenda, please contact City Hall.

The following topics were discussed at the June 4, 2013, meeting:

- 1. The Budget Hearing was opened. Several citizens voiced their concern regarding the increase in the monthly sewer fee. There was lengthy discussion to correct misinformation in a "We the People" hand out. After it was made clear that the monthly service rate brings in less revenue than the expenses, Council approved the Resolution increasing the sewer rates by \$1.50. The hearing was closed 1 hour and 40 minutes later.
- 2. American Flags Glen Snively stated that there are flags and poles that need to be replaced. It was suggested that he seek the funds necessary from the Downtown Association since they had originally taken on and funded the project.
- 3. A 4/10 office schedule was approved for the City Hall full time employees.
- 4. Mobile Office at the Bike Pit Derek Watson was there to represent the Bike Pit. Council directed the Bike Pit to remove the Mobile Office by July 20, 2013. A work session was also planned for June 20, 2013 at 7pm, for Council and the Bike Pit members, to discuss the future of the bike pit.
- 5. Council went into executive session to discuss a letter from the City Attorney.

While visiting with Donna Neuman and Laura Foley of <u>Ukiah</u> over some Fire Dept. questions, I happened to inquire what their water and sewer charges were. For those who find this interesting, Pilot Rock has a \$19.50 water charge and will have an \$18.00 per month sewer charge for a total of \$37.50 for water and sewer charges. (NOTE: That total does not include the Water Project, Public Safety, and Utility charges, which total \$9.00) Please note that our neighbors to the south pay \$41.25 for water per month, and \$27.00 for sewer. If you are a business, your sewer charge is \$35.00 per month. They also pay \$1.00 per month for a maintenance charge (savings account for emergencies) —or \$69.25 per residence. HMMMMMM? And did you happen to notice the jump Pendleton is looking at? We actually have it pretty good. I also understand that brass and copper parts for our systems will be taking a 35%-40% jump come January of 2014.

In closing, please Join me in welcoming home <u>Deacon and Janet Perkins</u> who have basically spent the last 30 years living at the coast! We're delighted you're home!



Umatilla Morrow Head Start is opening a classroom in Pilot Rock!


Our classroom will be located in the Pilot Rock Elementary School beginning September 2013!




