The July 5th meeting date has been cancelled due to lack of a quorum. It may be rescheduled at a different date if something vital needs to be addressed.

The Burn Ban is in effect June 15 until September 15, 2011. There is no burning permitted between those dates. Thank you for your cooperation!

Please note the underlined items in the event check list. This is new, and you need to be cognizant of the time lines for Council approval.

CITY OF PILOT ROCK

EVENT CHECK LIST

1. Form a committee, if applicable.
 2. Develop the plan for the event, including day(s) and time(s)
 3. Plan for number of participants that may be involved, for safety
 4. Determine if you need security or street closures
 5. Receive proper permits from the City (sound variance, parade permits, street closures, map detailing location or route). All permits must be submitted 30 days before event date.
 6. Receive proper permits from the State (ODOT) if using Highway 395 or OLCC, if alcohol is involved.
 7. All permits must be submitted to the police 30 days prior to event and longer if OLCC permit is involved.
- Determine servers for alcohol (must be licensed) and how will you ensure minors are not able to access the alcohol (i.e. monitors, fences, screening area)
8. Proof of insurance to cover event, if needed with the City listed on insurance.
 9. Present to City Council for approval 2 meetings before event, if needed.
 10. Ensure a responsible is on scene or available at all times before and during the event if questions arise.
 11. Understand your responsibilities as a sponsor or responsible person for the event.
 12. Pick up signed copies of event applications and forms once everything is approved and have available during event for inspection.


