The following topics were discussed at the last Council meeting.

- Recent articles in the EO are not completely factual. Anyone interested in getting the truth may stop by City Hall for a copy of a response sent to the editor.
- Patty Jones and Jon Staldine of the Umatilla Basin Watershed Council addressed Council with
- Charlie Carnes addressed Council with information regarding the new Marijuana laws and what it means to Pilot Rock. Council approved a street closure on May 27, 2015, on Cherry between NE Main and SE 3rd. So that the High School can host the State Baseball playoffs.
- John Taylor asked Council who approved Teri Porters response to the EO and his suggestions regarding the budget. Council was supportive of Teri's factual responses.
- At Mr. Taylors inquiry Council stated that no action is being done at this time regarding the deeding of the Bike Pit.
- Council agreed to consider an agreement with the City of Pendleton's Police department for Administrative services for the Pilot Rock police department.
- Council passed a resolution to receive state revenue.
- Council agreed that the additional \$10 sewer improvement fee, should be applied proportionately to all users including, businesses, schools, etc.
- Council also agreed that Council and staff will pay the \$10 sewer improvement rate.
- For the past 21 years, Council and City employees who live within the city have not paid the base sewer and water rate (they do pay any water used over base, public safety surcharge, water project fee and water and sewer reserve). For Council this was a benefit offered as compensation for the time and effort they put in serving on Council. For employees it was offered in lieu of a pay increase. There was much debate regarding whether to continue this practice and take this benefit away from Council and employees who live within the city. Council tabled the discussion until the June 16th meeting.
- Council agreed not to create the Lagoon Fund and transfer the A&V payments until the 2016-2017 budget. Doing so would not be allowed this year under budget law. All the money will be there next year and can be transferred at that time.
