The Next City Council Meeting will be held
on Tuesday May 20, 2014

1. Council approved the request to sponsor the annual Community Days Event.
2. Council approved the annexation of the property owned by Patrick Doherty on NW Cedar. The first reading of the ordinance was read and passed.
3. After a recommendation by the planning commission, Council approved a variance at 988 SW Cedar.
4. Ordinance No. 562 amending the Heavy Industrial Zoning Ordinance was passed.
5. A resolution transferring funds within the Library fund was approved.
6. Council approved the cost to upgrade the accounting software.
7. The Mayor and Councilors Moss, Hinkle and Deno seats are up for election this fall.
8. Working with the owner of the duplex at the foot of the old stairs, to acquire the property next door and obtain an easement. Then move forward with replacing the stairs.



CITY ORDINANCE

8.10.210 Trees, shrubs and weeds.

(1) No owner or person in charge of property may permit unreasonable growth of weeds, grass, or other noxious vegetation more than 12 inches to 18 inches upon his property or in the right-of-way of a street, alley or sidewalk abutting the property. An owner or person in charge of such property shall cut or otherwise destroy weeds, grass, or other noxious vegetation as often as needed to prevent it from being unsightly or a fire hazard, or maturing or going to seed.
