## City of Pilot Rock

The next scheduled City Council meeting will be May 21st, 2013 @ 7 pm in Council Chambers. If you have an item to be placed on the agenda, please notify City Hall.

The following topics were discussed at the May 8, 2013, meeting:

1. Council agreed to sponsor Community Days.
2. Council was informed that the Confederated Tribes of Umatilla Indian Reservation would like to meet with Council to discuss shared concerns. Council agreed to invite CTUIR to the June 18, 2013, council meeting.
3. Mayor Carnes brought up the concern regarding making bank runs for deposits, after Sterling bank closes in June.
4. Council agreed to start using the new evaluation worksheets for the 2014 evaluations.
5. Council agreed to give Teri Porter time off when her grandson is due to be born end of June or early July.
6. Excess legal fees due to an ongoing ordinance violation have caused the City Attorney budget line to be over. Council approved a resolution to transfer funds from Contingency to the City Attorney line item.
7. Chief Richman updated Council on the new reporting system that could cost the City over \$14,000.
8. Chief Richman also discussed the added dispatch fees of \$7,200 and who will sign the agreement.
9. Steve Draper informed council of the cost to extend the water main up NW Cedar. It will be put on the agenda as an action item at the next meeting.
10. Steve Draper also informed Council that American Tower would like to purchase an easement. It would also be put on the agenda for the next meeting.
11. Councilor Rowe asked that a breakdown of what the interest would be if we paid down the LOCAP loan be provided at the budget meeting.
12. Council was disappointed that no one from the Bike Pit board was present as requested, to discuss concerns. Council agreed that a letter from the Council President was to be sent stating that unless someone is at the next meeting, they will be forced to take further action.

They will resume review on May 22, 2013.






