Can Ranchers and Wolves Co-Exist?

A Symposium Hosted by the Oregon Cattlemen's

Association and Eastern Oregon University Range Club

• Key industry, environmental and wildlife experts from Oregon, Idaho and Minnesota will address wolf interactions with livestock as well as the overall social, environmental and economic impacts the presence of wolves have on Oregonians.

• The keynote speaker, Jim Beers, former chief of national wildlife refuge operations for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, now writes extensively and speaks to various organizations throughout the country about the federal wolf program and the cumulative impact of wolves on rural American life.

• Casey Anderson, who was born in Pendleton, grew up on a ranch and is currently managing the OX Ranch in Idaho. He will address wolf interactions with livestock, depredation, compensation and cattle behavior as well as the recent Idaho/Oregon Wolf Research Study made possible with funding by the Oregon Beef Council.

• This symposium is especially timely for citizens and livestock producers who want to be better informed about wolf issues when the Wolf Conservation and Management Plan is opened for its first 5 year review this year. It will also be informative for veterinarians and others interested in diseases found to be carried and transmitted by over 60% of the wolves in Idaho.

Summer Watering Hints

As we enter the hot summer season, watering our yards becomes a priority for us all. We want our lawns to be green and our gardens to thrive. We tend to think that this means we need to water every day. In fact, we do not. The most extreme crop water demand on even a very hot day will be only ½ inch of water. Most soil can only hold 2 inches of water in the first two feet of depth. Any more water may result in water runoff, which is a waste of the water you pay for. There are several methods that you can use to put this 2 inches of water in the soil to provide the ½ inch of water your garden may need every day. One method is to water ½ inch every day, or 1 inch every other day. The down side to this method is that the soil will only be moist on the very top surface of the soil and you will have very shallow root systems. You will also experience more water evaporation. Go on vacation or miss a very few days of watering and the garden dries up. Another method is to water deeply every three to four days and fill that top 2 feet of soil to its water holding capacity. This will encourage the root systems to grow deeper into the soil and give you a stronger plant root system. It also lets you be gone for a few days without worrying about the watering. A good way to find out how long it takes to get the amount of water we want on our lawns is to place a small container on the lawn while watering. Place a mark in it at the 1 or 1 ½ inch level. When the can is at the level you want, you are done watering. Use that as your watering time for every watering and you should be pretty close to your desired amount of water. Consider also the method of watering. The sprinkler is great for the lawn, but try a soaker hose for the gardens. It puts the water directly to the plant while reducing potential water evaporation. Remember water conservation is not only good for the environment, it is good for our pocketbooks!
