

Pendleton Center for the Arts

Artists from Pilot Rock and across the region are gearing up to create new work for the Open Regional exhibit, featured each year at the Pendleton Center for the Arts. A call for entry for the 2011 event has been issued. The exhibit offers both amateurs and professionals a chance to share their artwork with the community as well as vie for more than \$1000 in cash awards. Drop off date for artwork is Saturday, April 9th and the exhibit will be on view April 14 - May 15th.

Over 100 artists from Northeast Oregon and Southwest Washington participated last year and organizers expect even more in 2011. The exhibit is non-juried, so every work is accepted and displayed. Adults age 18 and over are invited and there is a special category for teens 13 - 18 years of age.

This year's event features painting, drawing, printmaking, sculpture, fiber arts, book arts and more. Photography is the only medium not accepted. The Arts Center offers free studio space for local artists who need a place to work on their creations. Interested individuals can call 541-278-9201 to schedule sessions.

The Open Regional has been hosted by the Arts Council for more than 30 years. Before the renovation of the old library building, the organizers used a range of venues, including BMCC and the Convention Center. Banner Bank of Pendleton sponsors the event each year, providing all of the cash awards for both adults and teens. Prizes will be awarded in several categories and visitors to the exhibit will have an opportunity to cast their vote for the People's Choice Award.

This year's judge is Charles Timm-Ballard, chair of the art department at Whitman College in Walla Walla. Timm-Ballard is a practicing artist with a thorough knowledge of ceramics, sculpture, art history, and contemporary art. He received his Bachelor of Fine Arts from the University of Wisconsin in Milwaukee and his Master of Fine Arts from the University of Nebraska in Lincoln. Before teaching at Whitman, Prof. Timm-Ballard taught at Pomona College, Lawrence University, and the University of Nebraska. He has exhibited internationally, held a residency at the Europees Keramisch Werkcentrum, and is the winner of numerous awards.
