It's a Wonderful Life !

Pilot Rock High School Theater Department presents *It's a Wonderful Life!*

The play will be produced Saturday, December 18, at 7:00 PM, Sunday, December 19, at 2:00 PM and a free presentation for Senior Citizens and the student body Wednesday, December 22 at 1:00 PM. All performances will be in the PRHS cafeteria. Costs for the Saturday production are \$5 for adults, \$3 for students and senior citizens and preschool are FREE. The Sunday matinee will include holiday treats and reserved seating with prices of \$8 for adults, \$6 for students and senior citizens and \$2 for preschool. Tickets can be purchased from theater students or call 541-377-3075 to reserve tickets.

It's a Wonderful Life is an Americanized version of Charles Dickens' *Christmas Carol*--only here, it is George Bailey's (Joey GrosJacques) kindly Bob Cratchit-like character who meets the otherworldly visitor that re-educates him via a frightful "Christmas Yet To Come." If you can see how Frank Capra echoes Dickens, you can make the story resonate with audiences better--and come off as an engaging theatrical experience. So, if *Wonderful Life* seems to be a delightful 1940s romp, a "trials and tribulations of George Bailey," dig a bit deeper to find Dickens' *Carol* beneath the Americana. While the miserly Mr. Potter (Kohl Griffith) is the obvious Scrooge stand-in here, it is George Bailey who takes on many Scrooge-isms as the story progresses.

George is unconsciously similar to his nemesis, Mr. Potter--someone George can't stand--but whom fate has shackled him to, because there's a lesson here for George. He and Potter are ambitious, imaginative men, but both have been frustrated by life. Potter is physically crippled, while George is crippled by circumstance. George can no more run away from Bedford Falls than can Mr. Potter in his wheelchair. Potter lives for money and George finds himself wishing to *die* for money--the insurance payout that will cover the \$8000 shortfall. Both are shrewd businessmen--neither losing his head in the bank panic, but both really love being in control--of their own lives and controlling/aiding the lives of their fellow citizens.

In *Wonderful Life*, George's journey is led by Clarence (Justin George), the apprentice angel, who, ironically, one-ups Mr. Potter's temptations by granting George's most selfish desire--to escape from Bedford Falls--by having *never been born*. George attempts suicide, but Clarence actually *makes it "happen"*, drawing his inspiration from Mark Twain's *Adventures of Tom Sawyer*--where a dream-chasing adventurer with big plans decides to fake his death and thus, see Aunt Polly and everyone in town mourn him at his funeral. Capra didn't have Clarence quote from *Tom Sawyer*, but the themes are threaded throughout *Wonderful Life*. George is both Tom Sawyer *and* Ebenezer Scrooge--the American Everyman at a crisis point.

Other characters include Mary Bailey (Kiauna Fritz) George's wife; the Superintendent Angel (Derek Hoisington) who guides Clarence to receive his wings, and Uncle Billy (Ian Austin) the bumbling assistant to George. This play has a large casts with many bit parts. Many of the theater students are casted in more than one part.
