

1. Brad Baird of Anderson Perry (the engineer firm of record) made a presentation regarding the warning letter from DEQ, stating the need to upgrade our waste water system (the lagoons). Items discussed were, the need for a feasibility study, various options for the lagoons, and an inevitable increase in sewer rates to pay for the improvements.
2. Council approved the annual resolution to receive State Revenue.
3. Council approved resolutions establishing both Water and Sewer rates.
4. Council approved a resolution adopting the 2015 budget.
5. Council approved a resolution transferring funds to the City Attorney line item of the budget.





The Mayor's Minute or Two !

It's hard to believe that we are already into summer, and with it what looks to be a major fire season shaping up. I would like to caution parents and children both to be extremely vigilant and keep your inquisitive and exploring children away from the Kinzua landfill. Children have been observed on the site by Chief Richman and removed. This is an attractive nuisance, out of our city, but not out of our concern. There are vents which could be deadly if a child or an adult would fall into one. The Fire Department only fights fire on the perimeter, and men and equipment do not go on the landfill. It's dangerous and we truly don't know how deep the vents go, but we do know it smolders year around, and we've had two fires within 6 days. If you see a child on the site, please notify an officer, call City Hall, or Dispatch at 541.966.3651! A barbed wire fence never kept anyone out of an area—especially a curious child. We dodged a bullet with the last fire on Monday. Had the wind been coming from the north, we can only speculate what might have happened. We owe a great deal to our fire department, and the mutual aid from Pendleton, tribal and ODFW. Please note that Jim Hatley and Karl Jensen also provided heavy equipment to cut fire lines.

The Bike Pit is looking for about 600 yards of rock free soil to use in building a mud bog. It also needs to be within a reasonable driving distance. If you know of an area where this can be attained, please notify any board member or myself. Your help would be appreciated!

Utility Billing Department

We are working on a Utility Billing Audit to ensure all property owner are being billed accurately.

Rates as follows and apply to residential and non-residential as well as developed and undeveloped property within the city limits.

\$5 Public Safety Surcharge (\$3 after July 1, 2014) Ord. No. 541 (2) & (4)

\$3 Water project fee for all properties receiving water service.

\$.50 water Utility Reserve fee for all properties receiving water service.

\$.50 Sewer Utility Reserve fee for all properties receiving sewer service.

\$ 18.00 Flat rate for sewer. (sewers that are in use or uncapped)

\$19.00 Flat rate for water (additional charges for water in excess of 15cf per month.)

The annual mass mailing of the Water quality report will go out soon.
