The November 5, 2013, regular Council meeting was cancelled due to lack of agenda items. The next regular Council meeting is scheduled for November 19, 2013. There will be two public hearings held during the next meeting. Council will hear public comments regarding an application to annex property on NW Cedar into the city limits. In addition Council will hear comments regarding an application to rezone the old motel from commercial to residential.

Citizens are encouraged to attend Council meetings which are usually held the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7pm in the Council Chambers.

City Council Seat Vacancy

There is a vacant seat on City Council. If you are interested in serving your community as a City Councilor, and you have resided within the city limits for the past 12 months, you may pick up an application at City Hall. Application must be turned in by November 18, 2013, at 5pm.

Planning Commission Members Needed

If you are interested in serving your community as a member of the Planning Commission, and you live within city limits or the urban growth area, you may pick up an application and a copy of the Planning Commission Ordinance at City Hall. If there are enough applications submitted, Council will consider them, at the November 19, 2013.

News from the Pilot Rock Education and Community Foundation

The Pilot Rock Education and Community Foundation was established 8 years ago. The Foundation began with a \$100 donation, which has grown to the current balance of \$19,000. The primary funding source for the Foundation is private donations and memorials.

However, a community reunion dinner on Friday evening of the Pilot Rock Community Days weekend is now an annual fund raising event. Alumni groups from PRHS are encouraged to attend, but the event is open and all are welcome to come and enjoy a fabulous inexpensive dinner. It is a wonderful opportunity for friends to sit and visit, which is the backbone of a small community.

The Foundation is a non-profit 501(C)(3) and provides money to successful grant applicants year-round for either educational or community projects. Some of the projects funded by the Foundation include: Little League softball to Arizona; round tables for the Community Center; Project Zero – Anti-Bullying project at the high school; sound system for community use; Art Outreach – local art classes; t-shirts for 5th Grade field trip to OMSI; t-shirts for the Key Club; downtown beautification project help to send two students to the FFA National Convention; and support to the community leather’s class. The Pilot Rock Education and Community Foundation also present several scholarships each year to graduating seniors from PRHS.


