Council Meeting
December 15, 2020 6:00 PM

A. Called to Order

Having a quorum, the Regular Council meeting was called to order by **Mayor Virginia Carnes** at 6:00 PM. Council members attended via phone conferencing and the following councilors called in: **Raymond Doherty, Robbie Young, Paula Evoniuk, Andy Sells and Jackie Carey.** Department Heads present were **William Caldera, Steve Draper and Teri Bacus.**

E. PRESENTATIONS

Jadon Herron provided an update on the Lagoon project. The bore work underneath the railroad has been completed. Contractor is working on the crossing under Birch Creek which is progressing very slowly. This process does not have an impact on the budget. The gravity sewer line has several locations that will be tying into the existing system. Some of the locations has bedrock which will require a hammer to complete the excavation. The lagoons are almost completed with the access road under construction to be done this week. The placement of the riffraff is ongoing and is approximately half complete. Due to the rain, it has been too muddy to install, and the contractor is waiting to finish when weather improves. The lift station is being worked on and they will be placing pumps soon and the electrical system. The collection system rehabilitation has been delayed due to subcontractor going out of business and a new subcontractor has been hired to begin work by the end of the month or the first week of January. The current schedule is for the project to be complete sometime in the middle of January. This date is based on weather and having no new issues which is optimistic. Therefore, it is most likely that it will be complete at the end of January. The contingency amount projected in the budget has been used but the project is still within budget. The bond closing is being coordinated to payoff the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) grant will take effect followed by the loan. Two bond resolutions will be presented to Council in January. Councilor Doherty asked about the schedule stating that he believed that the project would be completed by the end of 2020. Jadon explained that the unforeseen delays such as needing the hammer for the bedrock added days to the contract through change orders. Also, the drilling underneath Birch Creek is taking much longer than anticipated due to conditions of the creek. Councilor Doherty states that the contractor needs to be held to the original schedule. Jadon explains that the riffraff has been delayed to heavy rains and if it is placed too soon, the liner would be damaged. The other delay is renting the hammer and due to holidays they want to make sure that the hammer will be used daily. Therefore, waiting until January 4 to rent the hammer to keep costs down.

Councilor Doherty asks how the City is being compensated for use of the rock from the rock pit on City property. Public Works Director Steve Draper explains that the City will receive 1000 yards of one inch minus crushed rock remaining at the site. Councilor Doherty states that receiving 1000 yards of rock is outside of the contract and isn't permitted and would like the cost to be adjusted in the budget to reflect same. Jadon explains that the contractor was assigned to place the rock and where it comes from is outside of the control on how the contractor does it. We cannot dictate to the contractor on how the task is to be completed and the contractor met the obligation to place the rock. Councilor Doherty states that since the City supplied the rock, there should be a savings and he would like it verified to ensure the City is complying with the contract. City Recorder suggests that Jadon get with DEQ/USDA and forward their response to the City auditors for verification. Councilor Carey asks if the contractor can repair the roads that were affected by the project by mid-January. The contractor will have to place a cold patch asphalt temporarily and the final repairs will be complete in spring. Councilor Doherty also asked about the county road that was damaged during the project. He states that it was not addressed in the contract. Jadon will verify and will let the city know.

F. ACTION ITEMS

F-1 General Election Resolution #667 – City Recorder presented general election resolution #667 and asked Council to review the certified results received from the Umatilla County. The results declare Raymond Doherty, Jackie Carey and Kody Johnson have been duly elected. Kody Johnson received the most write-in votes at 23 and he has accepted the position. **Councilor Doherty made a motion to approve resolution** #667 and Councilor Evoniuk seconded. Councilor Young, Councilor Carey and Councilor Sells all voted yes and the resolution was passed.

G-1 Department Head Report – Police Chief Caldera explains that the candidate for the Police Officer position has declined the job proposal. He did not accept the position due to city policy that employees do not receive overtime pay. Overtime is given as compensatory time off instead of a monetary amount. The process of hiring a police officer will begin with all applications to be received by the end of January. Councilor Carey asked about if the police academy has been scheduled and Chief Caldera believes that there will be a class in February or March. City Recorder thanked Councilor Sells on her service to the City of Pilot Rock and read the plaque that she will be receiving.

- 13. Chief has been corresponding with a man who is wanting to move to Pilot Rock who has a lengthy criminal history.
