Council Meeting September 20, 2022, 6:00 PM

A. Called to Order

Having a quorum, the Regular Council meeting was called to order by Mayor Randy Gawith at 6:00 PM. Council members present were Councilor Raymond Doherty, Councilor Tegan Kaneaster, and Councilor Vernon Sandy. Councilor Aliina Kirby and Councilor Paula Evoniuk attended via phone conferencing. Councilor Derek Turner was absent. Department Heads present were Chief William Caldera, City Recorder Teri Bacus and Officer Daniel Badal. Public Works Director Steve Draper was absent. Citizens present were Ray Bacus, Rhonda Lazinka and Marcus Eley.

F. ACTION ITEMS

F-1 Oregon Paid Leave Program – City Recorder presents a new program that allows workers in Oregon to take paid time off. Large employers (25) or more are required to begin contribution to the paid leave trust fund on January 1, 2023. Small employers are not required to contribute but may choose so which would make them eligible to receive assistance grants. The paid leave is up to 12 weeks and employees are required to contribute beginning January 1, 2023. Employees are eligible for the program regardless of small employers electing to contribute or not. The amount is 60% of 1% of wages for the employee and 40% of 1% of wages for the employee. The program allows time off to take care of a family member. Annual costs were discussed. Councilor Sandy made a motion to not contribute and not cover the employee cost of the program. Councilor Kaneaster seconded. Councilor Doherty voted yes, Councilor Kirby voted yes, and Councilor Evoniuk voted yes. Motion carried: 5 Yes – 0 No

F-2 Alcohol License Request – City Recorder received a request from the Family Dollar for an off-premises beer and wine license. The application requires approval from the City. City Recorder explains the Oregon Liquor Control Commission (OLCC) licensing process. An annual report is received to review current licenses and if there is any reason to revoke the license. Citizen Marcus Eley states that he was present for the public hearing for the Family Dollar variance request to construct the building. He states that the representative for the Family Dollar made the statement that alcohol and tobacco would not be sold due to the proximately of the school. Councilor Doherty says that it should be in the minutes to confirm. If the statement was made, Councilor Doherty states that we should hold them to it. **Councilor Sandy made a motion to table awaiting confirmation of the**

minutes and Councilor Doherty seconded. Councilor Kaneaster voted yes, Councilor Kirby voted yes, and Councilor Evoniuk voted yes. Motion carried: 5 Yes - 0 No

Councilor Doherty states that alcohol license requests should be forwarded to the Chief of Police for approval.

F=3 Employee Vacation Request - Chief Caldera submitted his request for vacation. Councilor Doherty made a motion to approve the vacation and Councilor Kirby seconded. Councilor Kaneaster voted yes, Councilor Sandy voted yes, and Councilor Evoniuk voted yes. Motion carried: 5 Yes – 0 No

G-1 Department Head Report – Chief Caldera provides an update on the latest police officer interview board. The interview board voted unanimously to not hire the one candidate that attended. City Recorder provided an update on the old lagoon system. Lift station #2 is failing and new parts are unavailable. A new lift station will be required.
